Board Volunteers Open Paleo Center for Cycle Oregon Sept 12th and 13th

In mid-September over 1000 spandex-clad visitors descended on Fossil for the annual, Cycle Oregon Classic ride. Electric bikes were the rage this year. Swarms of cyclists also explored the backcountry between Mitchell, Spray, Kimberly, John Day and Monument, stimulating local communities and testing support systems. A shortage of volunteer visitor hosts has closed the Center to walk in visitors for most of 2022. In response, four Center Board members greeted Cycle Oregon visitors and shared the wonders of the John Day River Basin. Bonnie Lofton, Carol Hardman, Jeffrey Kee, and Steve Lundgren pitched in. The Center welcomed over 200 visitors on Tuesday the 13th during a cyclist layover day. Our new online video exhibit A River Flows Free was a hit, with cyclists. They sat with rapt attention for over 30 minutes to learn about the region's 10,000-year record of human settlement and the ancient geological history of Oregon.

Jason worked on a 2005 study of the Wheeler High fossil beds, and is interested in updating that original work, done at OPLI's request.

Your Board is pleased to report some progress in financial and leadership challenges:

- -Oregon Solutions facilitated a work session with Center partners on Sept 28 in Fossil.
- -In 2005, the Oregon Paleo Project was the first rural Oregon Solutions project.
- -We also recruited two geologist Board members who know the area well.
- -We secured a needed \$4000 grant from the Autzen Foundation.
- -We are working this year with the Fossil School District and Wheeler County to create and revise long term operating agreements.

We will also be working with the local community early next year to create a new business plan for the Center. The Plan will enable us to support our community and regional services more consistently year-round. The Center normally costs \$2,000 a month to operate. The Board wants to work into 2023 with a sustainable business plan that provides natural and cultural inspiration for another decade.
